

A R O U N D CHRIST CHURCH Being a Member at Christ Church

What does it mean to be a member of Christ Church?

I had the privilege of chairing the Task Force on the State of Membership in the Episcopal Church leading up to this summer's General Convention. We looked at what it means to be a member of a church in the 21st Century and how that compares with our canons. The canons are like our laws or rulebook. It helps us keep order and gives us some guidance on many issues around church structure. One of the things we found in our work was how open they are in varying interpretations. Becoming a member of a church comes with certain expectations and responsibilities. It's more than just checking a box or saying you are here. The most important aspect of being a part of this faith community is to be one who is faithful in worship within this parish and who works, prays, and gives for the spread of the Kingdom of God. According to our canons, that makes you a "Communicant in good standing." Being Baptized in any Christian tradition qualifies as membership in our church if you want Christ Church to be your spiritual home.

While each circumstance may be a little different, there are many ways to claim membership at Christ Church.

Coming from another Church?

Request a letter of transfer. You can ask your previous church to send us your information or you can ask us to request it. Jimi Paderick takes care of that in our office. Her email is jimipaderick@christchurchnewbern.com or you can call her at 252.631.5863. Requesting a letter of transfer is the easiest way to formally move your membership from one parish to another. Most branches of the Christian faith have some version of this process.

What if that's not an option?

We often have new members who come from a tradition that doesn't keep or have those records, or they do not recall in which parish such a membership letter might exist. No worries! If we have all your pertinent contact information and you are working, praying, and giving for the spread of the Kingdom of God, you are good to go. We have provisions in our canons that allow for these scenarios.

New to the faith or just new to church?

Much the same as above. We do hope you'll join us for a "get to know Christ Church" or "Episcopal 101" class that we offer periodically.

How old are adults?

In our church, members who are 16 and up are considered adult members.

Do I get to vote for Vestry?

Our diocesan canons say that one must be an Adult Communicant in Good Standing in order to vote for Vestry or for other parish-wide decisions. (Diocese of East Carolina Constitution, Article XIV, Section 2a). So, someone over the age of 16 who has been faithful in worship and is working, giving, and praying for the spread of the Kingdom of God.

What about Confirmation?

Confirmation is the sacramental rite by which a Bishop conveys the Holy Spirit on one who wishes to make a public affirmation of their faith. The practice dates back to the earliest days of Jesus followers (Acts 8:14-17). Our canons welcome and encourage all adult members of the church to be a part of Confirmation.

If you've been Confirmed by a Bishop in another tradition, you would be Received by the Bishop. While we always hope folks will take the step towards Confirmation or Reception, it's only a requirement for those seeking an elected office like Vestry or a diocesan-level position.

If you have questions about your membership status, don't hesitate to ask! We'll be glad to clarify and glad to help you request a letter of transfer.



From the Rector:

Too many of us have gotten suspicious emails or texts purportare not aware of anyone from Christ Church sending picture of ing to be the Rector asking "can you do me a favor?" These scams often impersonate the person or persons at the top of the organization. It doesn't just happen to clergy. There are plenty of documented cases of CEOs and Executive Di rectors from non-profit and for-profit groups. The Rev. Suzanne Hood has also been impersonated once or twice.

To reiterate what we have said on countless occasions, no one on the Christ Church Staff will ever send an email or text asking individuals to purchase gift cards. In those events where we might need something, we always name what we need directly in the first communication and why we are asking you specifically to do it. "Busy with the rigors of ministry" is not a reason.

This scam is part of an international crime syndicate, and there is not much we can do except to not fall for it. Here's how you can help: As soon as you receive a questionable email or text, forward it to communications@christchurchnewbern.com. That will alert the Communications Coordinator along with the Rector, the Associate Rector, and Director of Church Life. We wil send a parish-wide communication via email and text message se we'll all be able to better know what's going on.

Other things you can do:

- 1. Make sure the Rector's cell phone number is in your phone: 252.571.6892. If you get a text from someone saying it's him but it's not from that number, it's fraud, and you should ignore it or delete it.
- 2. Read these emails closely. They are often riddled with poor grammar and punctuation.
- 3. Check the email address. Emails from the staff of Christ Church will be from "@christchurchnewbern.com". The fraudulent emails never have that as part of their email address.
- Who is it from? When an email goes out from the Rector of 4. Christ Church, it comes from Paul Canady. Not "The Rev. Paul Canady," not "The Rev. H. Paul Canady III." We are ver intentional for it to just say "Paul Canady" since the scammers like to add other things to his name.

When in doubt, call the church office (252.633.2109) to ask. Or text/email another staff member, a neighbor, a family memb or someone else to double check what you're reading. While w

Vestry Elections - A Message from the Senior Warden

I wanted to update the congregation on the vestry nomination process for 2024. At the 2023 Annual Meeting, the congregation overwhelmingly expressed an interest in being more involved in the election process. In the discussions, the congregation wanted to help select possible nominees or to volunteer their own service. The outgoing vestry members met in July to begin this process. We sent a letter by mail to each household as well as emails, messages in the weekly Messenger, and announcements in church asking the parishioners for help as requested in the nominating process.

The congregation was given the month of August to send in names of possible candidates. We received one name from the entire congregation. At that time we asked for representatives from each commission and, together with the outgoing vestry members, generated names of possible nominees. This committee gives much thought into the selection of possible candidates. We ensure each candidate is a member in good standing and would bring their knowledge, life experience, time, and commitment to a three-year vestry term. It takes many meetings and emails to generate a slate of six candidates.

Members of the Nominating Committee and Vestry will receive any further names from the floor today, Sunday, November 3, at 10 am beside the Baptismal Font in the Nave. All nominations must be made and seconded to be valid, and each nominee must agree prior to nomination. No nominations will be received after 10 am, November 3. Biographies for all nominees will be available on or before Sunday, November 10. Voting occurs during the Annual Parish Meeting, which will be held Sunday, November 24. Parishioners must vote for FOUR nominees. We encourage you to pray for all the nominees and pray about how you will cast your ballot on November 24.

Cursillo Weekend


