VOLUNTEER SPOTLIGHT

Step Into Service this Fall at Christ Church

Summer was full of beach days, cookouts, and vacations, but now it's time to settle back into the rhythm of a new season. As school starts and routines return, it's also the perfect time to think about where God might be calling you to

serve on Sunday mornings at Christ Church.

Volunteering isn't just about filling a spot on a schedule - it's about finding a place where you can share your gifts, connect with others, and make Sunday mornings even more meaningful. Serving is a form of worship with your whole heart: greeting someone who may be walking through our doors for the first time, helping a child discover God's love in Children's Church, proclaiming scripture so that God's Word comes alive, lifting your voice in song, praying alongside someone, or serving Communion to your neighbor. When you serve, you don't just fill a role—you help create a space where people feel welcomed, loved, and drawn closer to God.

Here are some of the ways you can get involved:

- Eucharistic Ministers Assist in sharing the bread and wine at Communion, reminding us all of Christ's love poured out for us.
- **Prayer Ministers** Offer prayer and encouragement for those who need extra support and care.
- **Lectors** Bring scripture to life by reading God's Word aloud during the service.
- Greeters & Ushers Be a friendly face at the door, guide visitors, and help create a warm, welcoming atmosphere.
- **Choir** Lift your voice in worship and help lead our congregation in song.
- **Sunday School Leaders & Helpers** Share God's Word with our youngest disciples in a way that's fun, engaging, and memorable.
- And don't forget—kids can serve too! Children are invited to become Acolytes, helping lead worship by carrying the cross, lighting candles, and assisting at the altar. It's a beautiful way for them to grow in faith and experience the joy of serving.

Hannah Hutchins, our Director of Christian Formation, shared this important reminder:

"On Sundays, we need more people to help lead and walk alongside our young people in Sunday School. If you've ever felt even the tiniest nudge to give it a try—or if you can only help from time to time—I'd love to chat with

you. You might be just the right fit!

We also need caring adults on Sunday evenings with our youth group. And don't worry! Helping doesn't mean you need to have all the answers or lead a big lesson. Most of the time, it's simply showing up, listening, encouraging, and being a steady presence in the lives of our kids and teens. Your presence means more than you know."

Volunteering doesn't have to happen just on Sundays! Have you considered volunteering with our afterschool program, Growing in Grace (GIG)? It's a wonderful way to invest in the lives of children in our community. GIG provides a safe, nurturing space for kids to learn, play, and grow in faith after the school day ends. This fall, we invite every member of our Christ Church family to prayerfully consider finding a place to serve. Whether you've volunteered before or this would be your very first time, there's a spot just for you. From "front-of-the-church" roles to behind-the-scenes support, every act of service matters. Sunday School for Children and Youth

CHILDREN

Godly Play (children ages 3-4)

Godly Play is a class centered around storytelling and work time, which includes crafts and play. We will focus on teaching basic stories and what it's like to spend time in a Sunday School class. This class meets in the Godly Play room, next to the nursery.

Whirl (K-2nd grade)

This class follows the Whirl curriculum, which uses the Revised Common Lectionary to teach children about the Bible and Christian faith. Students will watch videos and follow up what they've learned with worksheets. This class meets in the room next to the vesting room.

Whirl (3rd-5th grade)

This class also uses the Whirl curriculum. The discussions will be different than the younger Whirl class because of the age difference, but these students will see similar videos and work on slightly different worksheets. We meet in the the Purple Pineapples room.

Pathways of Discipleship (POD, 3rd-5th grade): 5 - 6:30 pm, the first Sunday of the month

For our 3rd-5th graders, this group meets once a month to play games and share our faith. We meet on the first Sunday of the month at 5:00pm in the Purple Pineapples room.

YOUTH

Youth (6th-12th grade)

Our youth will be working through tough questions like "Who wrote the Bible?" "Why should I pray?" and "Why are there so many Christian churches?" They'll also learn more about people in the Bible and watch videos. Students will get to pick the questions they want answered, and they will build their own class based on their interests. These students meet in the Youth Room upstairs (across from the second floor living room).

Episcopal Youth Community (EYC): 6 pm, Second floor Sunday School wing in the Youth Room

EYC welcomes all middle school and high school youth. EYC gathers every Sunday from 6 to 7:30 p.m. (unless otherwise noted) in the second Floor Sunday School wing / Youth Room. Any young person in grades 6-12 is encouraged to be a part of this vibrant and energetic group.


Study Book: What Makes You Come Alive: A Spiritual Walk

with Howard Thurman

Author: Lerita Coleman Brown

Starting this Monday, September 8, the Contemplative Prayer Group will be exploring the spirituality of Howard Thurman, a Christian mystic, pastor, philosopher, author, educator, and civil rights leader. During the 1960's, Thurman served as a mentor and spiritual advisor to Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. who was greatly influenced by Thurman's contemplative spiritual writings and his teachings on non-violent change.



Author Lerita Coleman Brown states, "One of Thurman's lifelong quests was to inspire hope. . . His quest for a profound experience of the presence of God, of connection to all living things, serves as a model for any spiritual seeker."

Once when Thurman was asked by another theologian what needed to be done in the world, Thurman replied, "Don't ask what the world needs. Ask what makes you come alive and go do that, because what the world needs is more people who have come alive." As the Contemplative Prayer Group meets this fall, we will take a spiritual walk with Howard Thurman. As we go on this walk together, we'll help one another discover, "What makes us come alive."

Rector's Bible Study

The Rector's Bible Study gathers at 11:00am on Wednesdays in the Pelletier Room. This Fall, we will be exploring the book of Deuteronomy. When Jesus says he has come to fulfill the Law and Prophets, this book is foundational to understanding the Law as Jesus may have understood it. It can also be dense and heavy, so we will take it in bit-size chunks and look at themes that appear throughout the book.

Women's Book Study

The Women's Book Study is reading *Acedia & Me* by Kathleen Norris. Copies of the book are available for purchase at the Reception Desk (\$10.00).

Norris is a poet and essayist whose work focuses on the intersection of religious practices and the spiritual journey. In *Acedia & Me*, Norris explores all aspects of acedia, with the particular purpose of drawing a distinction between it and depression. As Norris continually illuminates, acedia possesses spiritual roots, and, thus, can ultimately only be treated with spiritual attention and resolve.

Join us Tuesdays from 10:00-11:00 in the Second Floor Living Room. Women of all ages are invited to attend. We open our time together with prayer, followed by reading the book aloud, and discussing. No preparation is necessary. You can join the group at any time.

Lectionary Class Returns

In this class participants discuss readings from each Sunday's services. The class meets Sunday mornings at 9:45 am in the Pelletier Room.

Key questions from a study guide kick off the discussions. Typically, discussions focus on what the readings may have meant to listeners in ancient times and what they mean to us today, as well as how the readings are connected and the meaning of unusual names, places, and events.

Camp Hope End-of-Summer Update

BY THE NUMBERS

- 31 campers attended Camp Trinity, with 32 registered.(17 boys and 14 girls)
- 25 of our campers live in the greater New Bern area.
- 24 returning campers and 7 new campers.
- Campers attended 7 different camp sessions.
- 4 campers are current GIG students, and 4 campers have a connection to our GIG program as a former GIG student, sibling of a GIG student, or a future GIG student.
- Campers were from 17 families. Several of our campers live with foster families.
- 16 of our 17 families requested help with purchasing camp supplies. We gave the families Walmart or Visa gift cards.
- 7 church volunteers transported Camp Hope campers to and from Camp Trinity.
- Christ Church parishioners wrote over 100 cards to Camp Hope campers. Our campers received mail every full day while at camp.

Last year, Angel Tree Camping covered the tuition for 7 of our 26 campers. We are still awaiting confirmation from Angel Tree regarding this year's tuition payments. However, thanks to very generous parishioners and a recent donation from Deion King, whose company, King & Lasso, recently purchased the Elks building, our Camp Hope fund is healthy. The fund can cover all tuition costs not covered by Angel Tree Camping.

A Camp Hope mom sent her thanks saying, "My boys miss you, and they miss their camp friends. You have made a big difference in their life." A huge thank you to our Christ Church family for faithfully supporting this ministry. In 2026, we will be celebrating Camp Hope's 20th year!







Memorial Service

Buddy Payne served as Assistant Camp Director at Trinity Center for 7 years before moving in March 2025 to be the Camp Director at DaySpring, the Episcopal Camp in the Diocese of Southwest Florida. He died unexpectedly on August 21 at the age of 35.

From the Docent Diaries

Docent Ministry is very important to Christ Church, one of the most sought-after places to visit in Historic New Bern. There are currently 21 parishioners serving six days a week to offer tours to visitors not only from New Bern but from across the NC State, the USA, and foreign countries. As they greet visitors, they are the first "face" of our Church. Here are some of their stories.

ELMER PRAUL

As you know I certainly enjoy being a docent at Christ Church. I think my second time, a couple of years ago now, a young man came in to do some repair work on the computers in the office. He stepped in the front door of the narthex, stopped dead, looked around and said " is this a church?" When I said yes he asked "what do you do here?".

I really didn't know what to say so I said "churchy stuff like sing hymns, pray and read the Bible." He just said "Oh", asked how to get to the office and went on his way. Since then I have thought of many answers I could have given him but probably best I stopped when I did.

DIANE SANWICK

I think the funniest story I ever heard was from a woman who asked if communion was about turning water into wine. It surprised me that she would think that. I asked her if she knew what the last supper was quiet and didn't respond. She left, however, knowing that Episcopalians don't turn water into wine.

Last week as I was finishing a tour, the sanctuary windows grew totally dark, indicating a storm was imminent. As we looked out the front door, we saw a great storm with rain coming sideways and great gusts of wind. The couple and their adult daughter ventured out anyway. After a few minutes I heard them talking on the front porch. I insisted they come back inside to wait out the storm. I told them

they'd be very comfortable in the parish house. When we got there, the wife said "Is this where they used to keep the horses?" I said "Horses? Yes" she replied "Did they keep horses here in the carriage house?" Obviously she misunderstood parish for carriage, and was disappointed when I told her, no, no horses in the parish house!

2025 CROP Hunger Walk

The 45th Annual New Bern Area CROP Hunger Walk will happen on Sunday, September 28th at Union Point Park. Christ Church will host a water station, and we encourage members to sign up to walk or donate to



support the event. CROP Walk raises funds to address nutritional and developmental needs of those in our community and around the globe. Locally, Religious Community Services (RCS) will receive 25% of the proceeds.

This year Christ Church is encouraging those who would like to participate in CROP Walk as part of a team to join up with Interfaith Refugee Ministry. IRM has joyfully invited all Christ Church members to join their CROP Walk team. Help raise money for those who are food insecure in our community and raise awareness for IRM at the same time.
