


ECW - We're Back

Choral Evensong

Evensong is a beautiful evening service in the Anglican tradition that features choral music, scripture readings, and prayers. This February's Evensong will take place on the first Sunday in Lent and is centered around themes of evening-tide or dusk and Lent. Choral selections include Josef Rhienberger's 8-part Abendlied, Timothy Sharp's stunningly beautiful O Gracious Light, Preces & Responses by local composer Matthew Hill, the Magnificat & Nunc dimittis in g minor by Herbert Howells, and John Stainer's classic God So Loved the World. These musical selections reflect a sound that brings to mind the words "beauty, serenity, peace" and will intentionally be presented at the end of the day - 5:00 pm on February the 18th.

Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper

The season of Lent is fast approaching, beginning with Ash Wednesday on February 14th. Before we enter into this holy season of penitence, we pause to prepare ourselves. Traditionally, the period of Shrovetide was observed before Lent, often with indulgence in food items that many would abstain from during



Lent and by going to a priest for confession. The English word shrive, means to give absolution for someone's sins, thus Shrove Tuesday was named after the custom of Christians to be "shriven" before the start of Lent. The Tuesday before Ash Wednesday is the last opportunity for this to happen.

Today we tend to celebrate Shrove Tuesday by eating pancakes. Join us for a pancake supper on Tuesday, February 13th from 5:00 – 6:30 pm in the Harrison Center. We will have pancakes, syrup, sausage, and bacon. Tables will be set up for dining, but you can also preorder plates to go. Adult plates are \$6, children's plates are \$4 for ages 3-10.
