Hardest Part: Hurt We Carry; Hope We Find

The Rev. Suzanne Hood will lead an adult formation class on Wednesday evenings from 5:30 to 6:30 pm in the Library entitled *The Hardest Part: Hurt we Carry, Hope we Find*. Life is a mix of joy and sorrow, love and loss, big wins and even bigger failures. Everything is much more fragile than we like to admit. In Lent we sit with the heaviness of that truth. For 40 days we stop pretending that things will suddenly get better and face the truth: life is fragile, and so are we. We will explore being human, the complexity that life is both terrible and beautiful, how to lament, the gift that imagination can be in the face of all of this, and the wisdom and love we can gain from it. Coming together in vulnerability we will learn how to better carry our hurts, and how to find hope in the midst. The class starts March 12.

“Not Counting Women and Children”

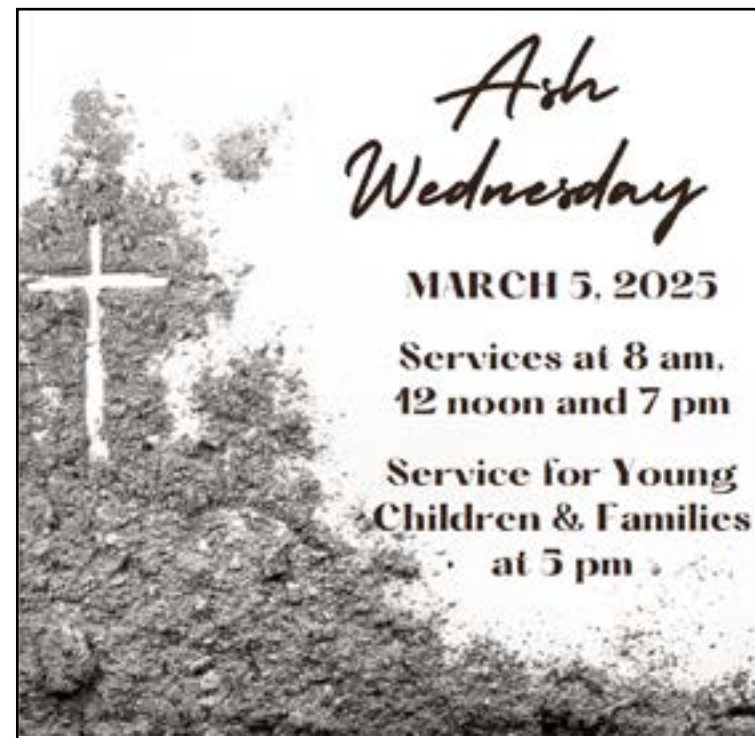

Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper



The season of Lent is fast approaching, beginning with Ash Wednesday on March 5th. Before we enter into this holy season of penitence, we pause to prepare ourselves. Traditionally, the period of Shrovetide was observed before Lent often with indulgence in food items that many would abstain from during Lent and by going to a priest for confession. The English word shrive, means to give absolution for someone's sins, thus Shrove Tuesday was named after the custom of Christians to be "shriven" before the start of Lent. The Tuesday before Ash Wednesday is the last opportunity for this to happen.

Today we tend to celebrate Shrove Tuesday by eating pancakes. Join us for a pancake supper on Tuesday, March 4th from 5:00 – 6:30 pm in the Harrison Center. We will have pancakes, syrup, sausage, and bacon. Tables will be set up for dining.

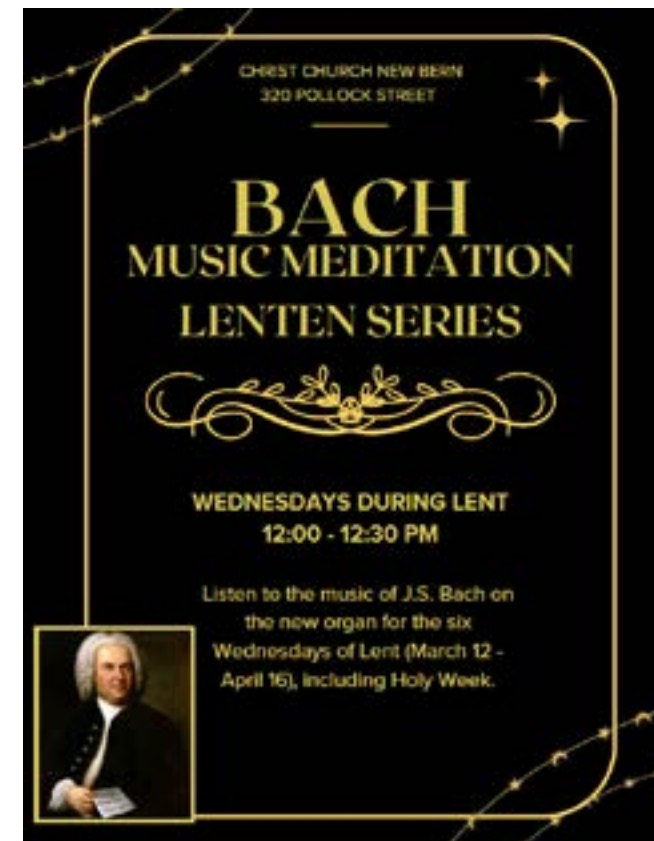

Spring Rothermel Lecture

Date/Time: 2 pm, Sunday, March 23, 2025

Location: First Presbyterian Church; 400 New Street, New Bern, NC 28560

Presenter: Norman Wirzba, Gilbert T Rowe Distinguished Professor of Theology & Director of Research in the Office of Climate and Sustainability at Duke University

Program: Loving the World that God Loves

The widespread assumption that planet Earth will soon become uninhabitable, and that we will therefore have to move to other planets, signals profound despair about our world. Christians are not immune to this despair. In fact, many think the goal of their faith is for the soul to escape Earth and live with God somewhere far, far away. The presentation will develop several scriptural passages to show why this other-worldly spirituality is a mistake. God loves precisely this created world and wants us to love it too. What that means and what it spiritually and practically entails will be our primary focus.

The lecture is presented by The Rothermel Foundation and is free and open to the public. The Rothermel Foundation brings to New Bern, typically twice each year, speakers of eminent reputation or accomplishment, or both, to speak on issues of interest or concern to people of faith, including science, religion, the arts, and cultural issues.

Bishop Selection Listening Sessions: Share Your Voice

Christ Church will host a listening session as part of the bishop search. It will be in the Harrison Center on Saturday, March 8 from 1-3 pm. Please plan to arrive a little early. This event is being advertised to the entire Diocese and will be one of several hosted by different churches around the Diocese. It is a chance for parishioners from various churches to come together and share what they are looking for from our next Bishop with members of the search committee.

The In-Person Listening Sessions are open for anyone to attend, even those who may also be participating in one of the virtual sessions. Virtual Sessions will take place on Zoom and many are designated for particular affinity groups or clergy roles within the diocese. There will also be two Zoom sessions for Laity who are not able to attend an in-person session. There will also be a session for diocesan staff. These listening sessions will be forward-looking and conversational, during which you'll be invited to share your answer to these five questions:

- Tell us about something exciting in your worship community and your wider community, and tell us about a challenge in your worship community and your wider community.
- In what ways has the diocese been a blessing to you or your parish?
- What opportunities and challenges face our diocese and bishop in the next five years?
- Jump ahead to 10 years from now. What accomplishments do you hope the bishop will have led us to?
- Is there anything you'd want to make sure our new bishop knows about our diocese?

In addition, over the next few weeks there is an opportunity to participate in an online survey, which is available in both English and Spanish. The survey is open now through March 9.

Music Notes

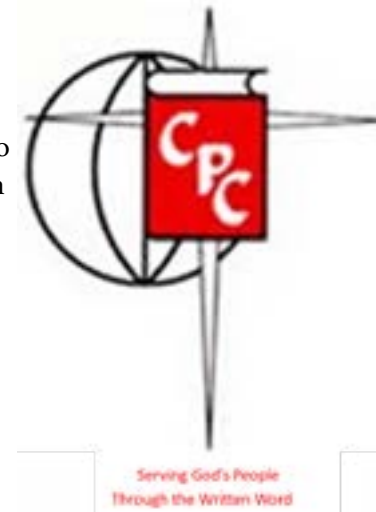

Mary Ann Drake Fargo and a small group of women began sending bundles of church periodicals, prayer books, and Bibles via the Wells Fargo Stagecoach Line to missionaries in the western part of the U.S. While delivery systems have changed, the commitment to supplying free theological and educational materials in support of missions around the world has not.



CPC is an independent affiliated organization and the only organization in the Episcopal Church dedicated solely to providing grants for written materials, both religious and secular, to people all over the world. CPC depends entirely on voluntary contributions to carry out its unique ministry.

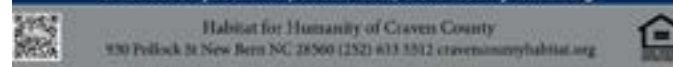

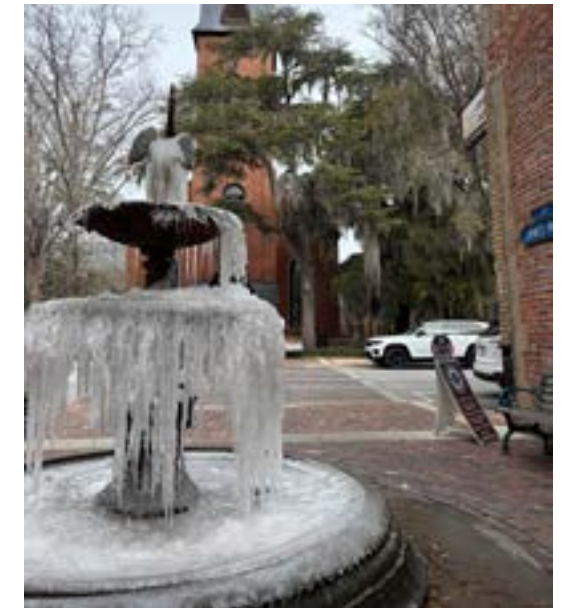
