# A Moment with Stewardship

Continuing our spotlighting and praying for the programs that make Christ Church such a dynamic place, this week we focus on Outreach and Parish Life.

From the new Christ Church Opportunity Guide, Outreach is described as a group of programs "able to relieve the suffering of so many in our

community by being the hands, feet, and voice of Jesus...a beacon of empowerment as we serve our neighbors in need." Jesus reminds us that when we help those in need, we are helping Him.

Pumpkin Patch, Cookie Walk, Growing in Grace (GIG), Camp Hope support our local charities and members of the community. Think of how our Pumpkin Patch is a community gathering place during the month of October and how Cookie Walk helps kick off the festive Holiday season in New Bern. Proceeds from these events benefit our local care partners.

GIG benefits children in the community as volunteers provide after school academic support and serve as mentors in the safety of the church. Camp Hope provides children of incarcerated parents the opportunity to experience the love of God and the joy of summer camp while offering a week-long respite for the special people that care for them.

Jesus also said that when two or three are gathered in His name, He will be in the midst of them. Parish Life turns inward to support our parishioners in Christian fellowship and support. Volunteers support funeral receptions, weekly Coffee Hour and seasonal Lemonade on the Lawn. Christ Church Cooks provides meal support to parishioners who, due to loss of health or a family member or who may be at home rehabilitating, are in need.

Potlucks, celebrations, and receptions enhance our fellowship and are overseen by Parish Life. This commission also oversees volunteers who choose to help by staffing the church reception desk. This valuable service relieves the staff of answering calls, receiving visitors, and repetitive tasks. This is another way volunteers work with the staff and are essential to church operations and cutting operational costs.

We pray with gratitude for those who both reach out to others and draw us in closer to one another. These programs help us make those important connections with each other, the community, and Christ.

Lord, we pray for the continued strength and grace of those who seek to empower others within our parish family and beyond. We give thanks for their dedication and hard work as they continue as the hands, feet, and voice of Jesus. Amen

# Children and Youth Offerings

## Godly Play (children ages 3-4)

Godly Play is a class centered around storytelling and work time, which includes crafts and play. We will focus on teaching basic stories and what it's like to spend time in a Sunday School class. This class will meet in the Godly Play room, next to the nursery.

## Whirl (K-2nd grades)

This class is using the Whirl curriculum -- the same curriculum as the older Whirl class. Students will watch videos and follow up what they have learned with worksheets. The best part of Whirl will be the craft each week! This class will meet in the room next to the vesting room.

## Whirl (3rd-5th grades)

This class uses the Whirl curriculum -- the same curriculum as the younger Whirl class. The discussions will be different because of the age difference, but these students will see similar videos and work on slightly different worksheets. The best part of this class will be what the students will learn about the Bible and the church. We will meet in the Purple Pineapples room.

## Pathways of Discipleship (POD)

POD meets at 4 pm, the first Sunday of the month to play games and share our faith. This group is for children in grades 3 -- 5. We will meet in the Purple Pineapples room.

#### Youth Sunday School (6-12th grades)

Our youth will be working through tough questions like "Who wrote the Bible?" "Why should I pray?" and "Why are there so many Christian churches?" They will also learn more about people in the Bible and watch videos. The best part of this class is that students will get to pick the questions they want answered, and that they will build their own class based on their interests. These students will meet in the youth room upstairs (across from the 2nd floor living room).

#### **Episcopal Youth Community (EYC)**

EYC meets at 6 pm, Sundays and welcomes all middle and high school youth. EYC gathers every Sunday from 6 - 7:30 pm (unless otherwise noted) in the second floor Sunday School wing / youth room. Any young person in grades 6-12 is encouraged to be a part of this vibrant and energetic group.

# SUNDAY OPTIONS Unholy Ghosts

Sunday School at Christ Church begins on September 10th. The Adult Classes offer a variety of content, each offering ways to deepen our journeys in faith, individually and as a congregation; of working towards the ideal of a Beloved Community.

In years past, the *Bridging the Gap* group (see below for more information) have presented classes with this ideal in mind. These have included book discussions and short films. This Fall's Sunday School program will be short videos and discussion from *The Work of The People* <a href="https://theworkofthepeople.com">https://theworkofthepeople.com</a> entitled *America's Unboly Ghosts*.

This six-week class will examine the history of the American Church and how it impacts our mission today as we strive to be the Beloved Community of God. During the coming weeks we will watch films and work with an accompanying study guide to converse and learn together. This study is based on the need to know, and accept, our history before we can act to bring about all that living in the Beloved Community entails. A quote from Rev. Michael Eric Dyson says, "...what I need you to do, just for starters, is not act. Not yet. Not first. First I need you to see."

*Bridging the Gap* serves with others in our church in deepening our Beloved Community through Adult Education/Formation offerings. The gap to be bridged as we work towards Bishop Curry's vision of a beloved community includes but is not limited to:

- How do we learn to speak with love and compassion to one another when we don't agree?
- How do we come to recognize our own biases, ingrained beliefs that may, or may not, be true?
- How do we join with others in our community to bridge the economical, racial, cultural, educational, and generational gaps?

More opportunities for exploring the above will be offered throughout the year. Notification of these will be in *The Crown* and the *Messenger* as we move forward.

**Study Book:** Praying with Thomas Merton: Companions for the Journey by Wayne Simsic (Used paperbacks can be ordered online through Amazon.)

Thomas Merton, a mystic and twentieth century Trappist monk, wrote passionately about deepening our relationship with God through a path of contemplative prayer. For Merton, to learn how to pray contemplatively is to learn how to open our hearts to God's transforming presence. Contemplative prayer, Merton writes, "begins . . . with a return to the heart, finding one's deepest center, awakening the depths of our being and our life." (Merton, Contemplative Prayer, p. 30). "Thomas Merton is a spiritual master," writes Wayne Simsic, "because he invites us down a spiritual path that we can all follow. Merton reminds us that we can all receive the gift of the contemplative experience if we are true to God's call and grace on our own pilgrimage." (Simsic, Praying with Thomas Merton, p. 32) This fall, you are invited to participate in a weekly Contemplative Prayer Group. During each gathering, we will support one another on our pilgrimage of prayer as we open our hearts to God's transforming, compassionate love.


# Open House, Open Hearts Revival

# Update from St. Cyprian's

#### WHAT WE HAVE LEARNED, WHAT WE ARE DOING

We continue to collaborate with the African American Heritage Center. We have begun programming events for African American History Month, February 2024, and for the New Bernwide Arts in April 2024.

#### **BUILDING REPAIR AND RESTORATION**

St. Cyprian's is blessed to have 18 beautiful stained-glasswindows. There are six small single panel windows depicting Christian symbols, eight medium size two panel windows depicting symbols of apostles and saints and four large three panel windows. The three panel windows face the 4 directions of the compass with the center panel depicting the main theme. The East window over the altar depicts Jesus as the Good Shepherd. The West window at the rear of the nave depicts the symbol for St. Cyprian. The North transept window depicts the Alpha and Omega representing Christ as the beginning and end from the book of Revelation. The South transept window depicts the six-sided star of creation, which is also a double trinity symbol or the star of David.

Plexiglas was installed to protect these windows. The installation on the large windows exposed the wood frames to the elements. The frames appear to have wet rot and are in need of repair. One piece of plexiglass on the South facing window was ripped off and broken in a recent storm, see photo. We are currently reviewing options as to the best method to protect these larger windows.
