


# **Upcoming Special Concert**

Crossing the Alps is an early music project tour based out of New Bern, North Carolina. # Flowers in Worship

Every Sunday the flowers on the altar are a beautiful embellishment to help us glorify God, but they are so much more than that. After the service the flowers are given to people in our community who are celebrating birthdays, are on our prayer list, those who've experienced a life change, are currently undergoing treatment for cancer or other illnesses, etc. These arrangements act similarly to our sharing of communion with those in our community who are homebound. They soak in the prayers of two services, bearing witness to God's love and to our love for God and each other and then they go forth to share that love with those who most need it.

The reality is that the cost of flowers has increased significantly and the number of people giving money specifically for altar flowers has decreased over time. We ask for \$40 when putting flowers on the altar, but the cost to Christ Church is around \$130-\$140 per week. After a healthy, in-depth discussion at the November Vestry meeting, the Vestry has opted to fully fund floral arrangements each week through the operating budget. Contributions will help offset that cost. We ask for \$40 per time you give flowers, but we also know that \$40 is a stretch for some people. If you can give more than \$40, we hope you will.

There are several ways you can sign up and contribute. There is a sign-up list in the Narthex (entryway to the church). You can fill in that information and then leave a check or cash letting us know for which week you are giving. You can also give online (<a href="http://www.christchurchnewbern.com/give">http://www.christchurchnewbern.com/give</a>). Please note in the Memo line why you are giving flowers. # Advent InGathering

For many years, Christ Church has provided gifts for the children of incarcerated citizens. We have partnered with Angel Tree to identify families, and parishioners have been unbelievably generous in providing for those children. Over the past several years, we have provided gift cards to the parent or guardian to ensure the child receives the gifts they most need and want. This year, our efforts will look a little different. Thanks to the generosity of so many people at Christ Church, we will not need to do a collection for Angel Tree. The families counting on our support will have it due largely to a surplus from last year's collection. Camp Hope is another ministry we support that is primarily with and for those affected by incarceration. We are grateful for the ongoing support from Christ Church to provide a camp experience at Camp Trinity for local young people. At this time, we are in a good financial position with regard to Camp Hope.

Our history of support for those in the prison system spans many years and reaches in multiple directions. Given the generosity of all of you, we are able this year to turn our efforts in new directions. This year's collection will benefit two areas of ministry with those who are incarcerated: Tried by Fire/My Sister's House (<a href="https://triedbyfireinc.org/">https://triedbyfireinc.org/</a>) and Prison Fellowship (<a href="https://www.prisonfellowship.org/">https://www.prisonfellowship.org/</a>). Tried by Fire/My Sister's House is a newer ministry for women coming out of prison and has a history of recent support from Christ Church. Prison Fellowship is a national organization that operates in prisons in Eastern North Carolina.

If you would like to donate to our Advent Ingathering please take a tag from the Christmas tree in the reception area. Each tag has an amount on it as well as a code. Please add your name and the code on your tag(s) to the signup sheet, which can be found on the table to the left of the tree. We will be accepting funds throughout the season of Advent. Payments can be made online, or by placing cash or checks in the box in the reception area. Please be sure to check your name off the list when you have returned your donation.


### Celebrating the 25th Annual Cookie Walk





#### December Worship at St. Cyprian's

• Morning Prayer, 11 am, Sunday, December 15
The entrance to the church is by stairs at 604 Johnson Street, in the Historic District of New Bern. All are welcome.

The New Bern Historical Society's Ghostwalk brought over 200 visitors into St. Cyprian's Church. Tours were offered, and many interesting and interested discussions ensued. Folks loved the peacefulness of the sacred space. They were intrigued by the stained glass windows, the cruciform structure, the beams of the nave ceiling, the beautiful old organ and the gleaming white sanctuary with its glorious Good Shepherd window, illuminated by the lighting indoors and visible from the street. Participation in this community event engendered much good will, and made connections with those who attended.

On December 14th, St. Cyprian's Church will participate in the New Bern Holly and Ivy tours of historical homes and churches, from 10:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. We look forward to welcoming more visitors and introducing them to St. Cyprian's. In addition, visitors will be able to register for a new class, "Finding the Holy Spirit," for six evenings beginning in January. This class, taught by The Rev. Margaret Pollock, will explore the spiritual yearnings that God has planted in human beings, will learn to notice and articulate them, will share their experiences, and will learn how to follow their leadings to God. This class is intended for those not used to attending worship services, but would be beneficial for anyone. The fee will be \$25 per person.

Saint Cyprian's Church, along with its partner the African American Heritage and Culture Center, continues to work with the Bishop's Committee on St. Cyprian's. We are hopeful that good things will result, according to the leading of the Holy Spirit.


# Holiday Backpack Blessings

### Lil Pantry

We are always seeking ready-to-eat food and drink items for our outdoor Lil Pantry. Examples include: small bottled waters/ juice boxes, ready-to-eat canned items with pop tops, crackers, and breakfast bars. Items can be placed into the pantry or on the shelves of the white bookcase in the Parish House kitchen area.

### Be Aware of Scams!

Too many of us have gotten suspicious emails or texts purporting to be the Rector asking "can you do me a favor?" The fraudulent originator of the email will then ask you to purchase gift cards (Target, Ebay, iTunes, Walmart, Google Play, etc.) and send them a picture of the back of the card. That's the part that has the gift card number and PIN that will help them make an online purchase.

These scams often impersonate the person or persons at the top of the organization. It doesn't just happen to clergy. There are plenty of documented cases of CEOs and Executive Directors from non-profit and for-profit groups. The Rev. Suzanne Hood has also been impersonated once or twice.

To reiterate what we have said on countless occasions, no one on the Christ Church Staff will ever send an email or text asking individuals to purchase gift cards. In those events where we might need something, we always name what we need directly in the first communication and why we are asking you specifically to do it. "Busy with the rigors of ministry" is not a reason. When in doubt, please call the church office 252.633.2109 to ask.
