This week we are grateful for all the wonderful ministries that provide Pastoral Care to our congregants. We are also grateful for all the ways our rectors and deacon provide not only leadership but personal and group support to us. These are the conduits for Christ Church to provide love,

peace, and hope to those within our parish.

The Prayer Shawl Ministry members knit or crochet shawls for people who are experiencing illness, loss, or other difficult life transitions. The shawls provide love as well as comfort and warmth. Nap blankets are provided to children in need of comfort; and prayer squares, given by the rectors, are available for people to carry in a pocket or purse as a reminder of God's love and care.

Stephen Ministers reach out to those in the congregation who are suffering from loneliness, anxiety or pain, or going through a difficult transition. They are trained to provide distinctively Christian individual, weekly, confidential care to other Christ Church members. Nothing says "I care" more than a willing ear to listen.

Lay Eucharistic Visitors take Holy Communion directly from communion at church to the home of those unable to attend, symbolically including them in communion with the congregation as the service comes to a close with them. Similarly, Christ Church Visitors visit homebound parishioners but on a monthly or bi-monthly social call, sharing the news from church, establishing friendships, and strengthening ties to the parish.

These very personal ministries allow volunteers to actively promote connections of love and caring. They are a way of "accepting the invitation to show up in life [which] is about moving from the bleachers to the field... about having things matter to us enough that we stop just thinking about those things and actually do something about them." (Bob Goff) These ministries come from the heart of the giver and go to the heart of the receiver.

Lord God, we are thankful for Jesus, and his apostles after his Ascension, who showed compassion to the sick and the injured. We give thanks for the Pastoral Care Commission and our clergy for all the ways they carry on in the tradition of the apostles serving others. We pray that God will continue to open doors for their work to be the very heart of God to those who need it. Amen.

## Invitation to Realm

As many of you know, we have moved to a new kind of church record-keeping solution at Christ Church, called REALM. It primarily serves the administrative needs of our staff but also offers some exciting opportunities to support the way you are involved in your church. Not only will this improve work life for our ministry staff, but it will also make it easier for our church family to connect with each other, remain informed, and grow as a connected community. You determine how much you want to make this part of your experience with your church, but we encourage you to participate.

In the coming week you will receive an email invitation to join Realm. As long as we have your current email address, you will receive the invitation.

Everyone in our church gets a unique profile. Your profile contains everything you want people in our church to know about you and enables you to join a small group, track your own giving, update your contact information, and change family details. By keeping your information current, you are helping our staff, group leaders and church community. Your profile includes:

- Contact information
- Family members
- Personal information
- Connections to social media accounts.

You have complete control over who can see your contact and personal information. You can also track your giving history and print your contribution statement.

But first you must click on the email invitation, update your profile, and OPT IN to Realm. Please review your entire profile and correct any errors. Make sure children in your household are entered on your family profile. Please be sure to check that your date of birth is entered and that there is an updated email address.
