

Study Book: *Praying with Thomas Merton: Companions for the Journey* by Wayne Simsic (Used paperbacks can be ordered online through Amazon.)

Thomas Merton, a mystic and twentieth century Trappist monk, wrote passionately about deepening our relationship with God through a path of contemplative prayer. For Merton, to learn how to pray contemplatively is to learn how to open our hearts to God's transforming presence. Contemplative prayer, Merton writes, "begins . . . with a return to the heart, finding one's deepest center, awakening the depths of our being and our life." (Merton, Contem*plative Prayer*, *p. 30*). "Thomas Merton is a spiritual master," writes Wayne Simsic, "because he invites us down a spiritual path that we can all follow. Merton reminds us that we can all receive the gift of the contemplative experience if we are true to God's call and grace on our own pilgrimage." (Simsic, Praying with Thomas Merton, p. 32) This fall, you are invited to participate in a weekly Contemplative Prayer Group. During each gathering, we will support one another on our pilgrimage of prayer as we open our hearts to God's transforming, compassionate love.

Sacred Ground Coming in September

Christ Church is offering Sacred Ground to its parishioners beginning September 17 and running through February. These meetings will be in the evenings for 90 minutes.

Sacred Ground is a film-and reading-based dialogue series on race, grounded in faith in Jesus. Sacred Ground is a sensitive prayerful resource that creates space for complex but respectful and transformative dialogue on race and racism. Participants are invited to peel away the layers that have contributed to challenges and divides of our present day. It invites participants to reflect on family histories, and stories, as well as essential narratives that shape the collective American history. Sacred Ground holds as a guiding star the vision of a beloved community, where all people are honored, protected, and nurtured as loved children of God who weep at one another's pain and seek one another's flourishing.

All articles and films will be available online to be read and watched on your own time. The two core books for class are *Waking Up White* by Debby Irving and *The Disinherited* by Howard Thurman. Both books are available on Amazon.
