APRIL IS UTO MONTH

What is UTO? We are daily confronted with Acronyms such as TSA, SSA, FBI and most of us know what they stand for. But do you know what UTO stands for? It is UNITED THANK OFFERING.

April is UTO month at Christ Church and again, do you know what that means?

It is a time for us to pause daily to give God thanks for our blessings, large and small. We often say "thank God" but this is a time to put those words in action by setting aside a portion of our blessings to help people across the country and the world.

Started by two Episcopal women in 1889, who envisioned a way to collect small thank offerings, UTO has grown to be a an Episcopal Church ministry to the whole world.

Some of us like to physically put coins or bills into a special Mite Box provided by the church and others write a check. Those funds will be collected on April 27th. In the Reception Area, there is a display of Mite Boxes and envelopes for you to take home. There is also be a donation box with the display so you can make your contribution whenever you like. Last year Christ Church donated \$2,539.74!

Don't forget to let your children participate by putting aside some of their coins in a Mite Box. It can be an evening discussion at the dinner table to talk about something good that happened during the day which made us thankful.

UTO collects these monies and awards grants to organizations that are in need.* The 2025 campaign is focused on water-related projects, drawing inspiration from Jesus' words "I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink" (Matthew 25:35), with the goal of funding initiatives that address water access, quality as well as education issues within communities; needs of unhoused people and related health concerns.

Please plan and prayerfully consider your many blessings and how you can be a party to making lives better in our community and around the world.

MUSICAL REFLECTIONS

Reflection is a word that can sometimes feel synonymous with Lent. As we begin to approach Easter, these final weeks of Lent provide us with the opportunity to reflect not only on Christ's Passion story and journey, but also on our own story and journey as a congregation at Christ Church, particularly our musical offerings, which have been substantial, both within our church community and the greater community of New Bern.


Since the new organ installation in August of

2024, Christ Church hosted a celebratory Organ Dedication Concert with Nathaniel Gumbs in September (with an estimate of at least 400 people in attendance), a silent-movie night featuring the new organ in October, a beautiful Requiem concert with choir and orchestra in November, and a very full Lessons & Carols that was accompanied by string quartet with the organ in December. Oh, and also Christmas Eve!

Then at the beginning of 2025, Christ Church provided Choral Evensong via the Diocese of Eastern Carolina's Schola Cantorum group, we kicked off our new Organ Recital Series with a Valentine's Day Organ Concert that had a very large audience turnout, directly followed by a Carolina Chamber Music Festival concert in the nave (the first CCMF concert since the new renovations). Indeed, it's been probably one of the busiest music season's at Christ Church, and it's not quite over yet!

The Parish Choir is currently preparing to bring you a very beautiful and thought-provoking evening of music for our annual 'Music at Passiontide', which will take place on Good Friday, April 18th at 7:00 pm in the nave. The choir will be joined by singers from the community, as well as a wonderful vocal soloist, and accompanied by string quartet.

Opening with a single movement from Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart's famous Requiem, titled 'Lacrimosa', we will listen to scripture followed by an original setting of



choral music based on the Passion story as told by John, titled St. John Passion; this longer musical work of about 40 minutes is a kind of mini-opera.

Johann Sebastian
Bach composed a famous
setting of the Passion
story (with the same title)
where a character called
'the Evangelist' acts as
the storyteller. The choir
represents 'the Crowd'
in the story, but they
also provide moments
of respite and reflection,
giving listeners time to
ponder on the words of

scripture through the singing of familiar hymns and other choral anthems that connect to the text.

The St .John Passion that you will hear on Good Friday will follow the same format as the one composed by Bach. A solo tenor voice will provide the voice of the Evangelist telling the story, interspersed with hymn arrangements and original choral works sung by the choir. The string music will reflect the multi-faceted and complex emotions of the Passion story in abstract form, and the choir music will express those emotions from the perspective of the crowd (i.e. us, the listeners).

Music has the capacity to express those emotions which are difficult to articulate with words. Even the Evangelist, who is supposedly the neutral storyteller, becomes wrapped up in the emotion of the story as he becomes suddenly breathless (musically-speaking) at the moment of Crucifixion in the context of his own storytelling.

The evening will end in silence as we exit the nave reflecting on the story of the Passion of Jesus Christ. And on the following day, Holy Saturday, we experience the beauty of the Easter Vigil evening service in anticipation of Easter morning and with the previous evening's Passion story close in mind.

The Vigil will begin quietly outside with a fire and proceeds into the nave with chanting of the Light of Christ - thanks be to God!

Why We Watch

Can you not stay awake one hour? It's a powerful question from Jesus to his disciples shortly before his arrest. The three days leading up to Jesus's resurrection are marked by a single service, which begins on Maundy Thursday and ends with the Easter Vigil on Saturday night.

As followers of Jesus, we are invited to remember his invitation to stay awake, to watch, and to pray. We mark this time by keeping watch, beginning on Thursday evening and concluding on Friday at noon. This roughly equates to the time between Jesus' arrest and his crucifixion.

We invite you to sign up for a one-hour time slot to be in the Chapel. You can pray. Write. Mediate. Read. We will have other suggestions if you don't know where to start.
