Stewardship and Children

This week we continue our series to provide concrete information about stewardship, proportional giving, and ways to look at what we give as a family invested in Christ Church and its mission.

I'll just go ahead and say it. I'm of "a certain age." When I was a child, putting a few pennies in a Sunday School envelope each week and carefully placing it in the offering basket was a solemn expression of my thanks to God. It taught me to be grateful for my blessings and introduced me to the concept of stewardship—although I never heard it called that until I was much older.

The days of little white envelopes containing a few pennies placed in a basket may be behind us, but our younger children can talk about blessings and being thankful to God. They can share what they see God doing for them each day as they look around at their parents, friends, and the beauty of nature. Once again, they can add leaves to the blessing tree in their Sunday School classes.



Pray Gratefully | Serve Responsibly | Give Generously

The older kids at EYC can discuss stewardship in more adult terms. Last year they filled out time and talent pledge cards. In preparation for Harvest Sunday, they will evaluate their commitment over the past year as they prepare to fill out this year's time and talent pledge cards.

And this is how we learn about stewardship—living our faith by first praying gratefully for all we've been given, then by serving responsibly whenever we see a need at church, and finally by giving generously to help the church fulfill its mission and ministry in the community.

As parents and grandparents, we can help our children and youth gain an understanding of stewardship by talking with them about why we give out of our abundance back to God. They need to see us responding as stewards as we care for our Earth, ourselves and our bodies, our talents and spiritual gifts, our time and priorities, our relationships with them and others, and our treasure and material possessions.

Talk with them about the blessings they receive every day. Urge them to show gratitude to God as they worship and learn at church and in Sunday School. Give them suggestions for helping the church reach out to share God's love to the world. Let them know how you strive to be a good steward as well.

Dear beavenly Father, help us remember that Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me...for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these." Let us all be like children, open to the wonders that surround us and thankful for the gifts You have bestowed upon us. Make us faithful stewards of all You have given us—our earthly home, our families, friends, food and shelter, the joy of community with others. Never let us fail to recognize Your abundant blessings in our lives. Amen

We disconnected the sound system this summer to do the work in the balcony. Those speakers have not worked since the system was reconnected.


We have new speakers on order and believe that they will be installed next week. Once they are in place, we can assess what other adjustments need to be made.



October 16 Vestry Recap

- Vestry approved transfer of Endowment funds earnings (\$30,704) to Special Funds to offset budget.
- Camp Hope hosts children with an incarcerated parent.
 Camp Trinity will reserve spaces for 2024 Camp Hope attendees.
- Bishop Skirving met with St. Cyprian's Vestry to lay out a plan for the Church to operate as a parish.
- He will be at Christ Church on November 12 for a 4 pm service.
- The Christian Formation job description will be posted November 1.
- Financial report was reviewed. The organ balance of \$105,000 is due on setup, probably in March.
- Speakers for the sound system are problematic and will be replaced. Two cameras were added to the Parish House and Education Room entrances. The AED's are here and will soon be in place in the Church and at the Harrison Center.
- Discussion on the Vestry nomination process will be taken to the parishioners for input and further discussion.

- Parish Life four funeral services held this month volunteers needed.
- Outreach MERCI Clinic and RCS Executive Directors have recently stepped down. Interfaith Refugee Ministry welcomed 165 refugees this month.

- Evangelism The grant application process for the Trust and Outreach Commission, now entitled Christ Church Trust/Outreach Grant Application, is on the Church website.

Jimi Paderick, her successor, begins Monday, October 23, which allows time for transition and training, as she has big shoes to fill.
