

WHAT WE HAVE LEARNED, WHAT WE ARE DOING

Harry Gormley gave a tour of St. Cyprian's to Laura Smith's Fourth Grade class from the Epiphany School of Global Studies. This class is a member of the NC-statewide Tarheel Junior Historian Club, sponsored by the NC Museum of History. In the spring Mrs. Smith's class will make a competitive presentation at the annual State Convention of the Club. The students are very interested in the history of St. Cyprian's as an African-American church with significant presence in the community through the years. They want their presentation to heighten awareness and understanding of St. Cyprian's at the NC State level. Before going to the State Convention, the class will make their presentation at school, and interested visitors are invited to attend. Outreach to the schools is one of the important works St. Cyprian's seeks to do.

BUILDING REPAIR AND RESTORATION

St. Cyprian's continues to file grant funding requests to move forward with building repair and restoration. In the meantime, the African-American Historic and Cultural Center holds meetings and does business in the St. Cyprian's undercroft, making good use of the space.
