FROM THE RECTOR

Who do we call?

What written plans do you have for the end of your life or if you are otherwise incapacitated? I, along with several ministry colleagues, have dealt with this in recent months. Without divulging private, pastoral information, there are some important things I hope to convey and reiterate based on these recent experiences. This is something every adult, from 18-108, needs to consider. Many at Christ Church, regardless of age, do not have family near by. So if sudden illness, death, or other issue happens, who will communicate with family or friends? Who might know your wishes? Have access to medical personnel?



Having a Power of Attorney established can help with many of these issues. A Power of Attorney gives someone you designate the authority to act on your behalf in medical, legal, and financial matters. It is a legal document. There are formats available online, but working directly with a lawyer will really ensure things are how you want them, especially if you have a complicated situation.

Also important, and a lesson based on other recent experiences, is an upto-date list of who to call in case of emergency. I recently had information on someone that dated back to 1997. It was an amazingly comprehensive document, filled with helpful information. Names were still accurate, but in most cases, the phone numbers were way out of date. It is critical that a list like this is regularly updated, and that you let someone local know where that list is. Thankfully, through the magic of the internet, we were able to track down out-of-town family members.

Have you designated ICE contacts in your cell phone? ICE stands for In Case of Emergency. Once those contacts are designated in your phone, they are available even if your phone is locked. One person recently told me that all of their ICE contacts also know where all of the important paperwork is in their house and how to access it. This person is in good health but does not have family in New Bern. Having that information accessible to friends and family can save time and effort in the event it is needed.

We are happy to be one of the places that keeps copies of important documents. We have a secure filing system that currently has funeral plans for numerous parishioners and in many cases includes contact information, copies of Powers of Attorney, and other vital paperwork. In several situations recently (not just the one I mentioned above), ready access to information in those files have been helpful to us and to family members.

If you have any information (funeral plans, who-to-call, Power of Attorney, etc) you'd like us to securely keep on file, please contact Ellie Roberts. If you would like to talk more about end-of-life plans, reach out to one of the clergy. We would be honored to walk you through it.

Director of Music Update

We are grateful for the talent and leadership of Joyce Baker and Mary Ann Jones who have been leading music at 8:30 and 11:00 am respectively in the month of January. Joyce will continue leading music at the 8:30 service during February, and we will shift to a team approach for the organist at 11:00. We will still see Mary Ann on occasion, but there will also be other musicians who occupy the organ bench, too.

Finding an interim-Director of Music has proven to be more difficult than anticipated. Potential candidates are either currently employed or taking an intentional break. The good news is that the search committee has begun its work, and the job listing will soon be posted in numerous places. We don't have a defined timeline for a new person starting, but trust the Holy Spirit will keep us on the right track. I also trust and believe that as God is preparing us for our next Director of Music, God is preparing someone to come be with us.

Jean Reichenbach is a also playing a pivotal role for Christ Church. She is continuing where we left off with children's music and ukeleles and directing the hand bell choir. Jean is also helping the 11:00am Parish Choir prepare for Sunday. With her years of expertise and connections throughout the Episcopal/Anglican music world, Jean is also chairing the search committee. Other members are Harry Ballard, Bill Brubaker, Susan Husson, Kathryn Jasper, Dan Palimetakis, Jettie Pelletier, John Steady, Mimi Watrous, and Mark West.



Stewardship Update -- Faith

This Bible passage came to mind when some parishioners told us the Moringa seeds sent as a thank you gift from Christ Church to those who pledged for 2023 are growing in their homes. We haven't been quite as successful with ours—but only because we just started the planting process. The seeds just finished their week sitting on the soil under plastic wrap after a good overnight soaking and soon will be fully planted. Then we wait. We've been told it takes faith in the form of patience to see the seeds sprout but that it's worth the wait to see the little trees grow to 6" or more fairly rapidly.

And so it is with the Stewardship Campaign. We had wonderful, generous responses to the "Grounded in Faith, Growing to Serve" campaign in increased time, talent, and treasure pledged to Christ Church. We are exceedingly grateful! For those who may have forgotten to turn in pledge cards or just got a late start as we did planting our seeds, we have faith that we'll start seeing further growth soon. 




The Order of the Daughters of the King

2022 Christ Church Trust Grants Report

The Christ Church Trust awarded \$47,265 in grants to 16 different agencies in our area. The Trust followed the formula laid out in its 1975 founding document, which calls for the fiduciary accounting income, which means distribution is based on the divided income, not on the total value of the fund. Distribution for a while was based on the total value of the fund, and in 2023 the Vestry will be looking at the pros and cons of altering the rules for us to be able to distribute more to those agencies and groups we are thankful to support.

The current value of the Trust is just over \$1.5 million. The best way for it to grow is through direct contributions. We hope that as you wish to remember Christ Church in your will or estate or remember or give thanks for a loved one, gifts to the Christ Church Trust go a long way!
