Church Periodical Club

The Church Periodical Club (CPC) began in 1888 at the Church of Holy Communion in New York City. Mary Ann Drake Fargo and a small group of women began sending bundles of church periodicals, prayer books, and Bibles via the Wells Fargo Stagecoach Line to missionaries in the western part of the U.S. While delivery systems have changed, the commitment to supplying free theological and educational materials in support of missions around the world has not.

CPC is an independent affiliated organization and the only organization in the Episcopal Church dedicated solely to providing grants for written materials, both religious and secular, to people all over the world. CPC depends entirely on voluntary contributions to carry out its unique ministry.

The Episcopal Church Women (ECW) of Christ Church is pleased to again offer this opportunity for giving! In previous efforts, the East Carolina Diocese has given several seminarians over \$400 each to cover some of their periodical and related materials expenses.
