LITURGICAL MUSIC EVENTS

- Schola Cantorum is singing a Choral Evensong accompanied by the new organ on Sunday, February 9th at 5:00 pm. Evensong is a beautiful service in the Anglican tradition.
- The Parish Choir will continue chanting a "St. Anne" themed setting of the psalm throughout Epiphany (tune: O God our help in ages past), culminating in J.S. Bach's St. Anne Fugue (E-flat major) as the organ postlude on Transfiguration Sunday, March 5th, the last Sunday in Epiphany.

- Women Composers Sunday is March 9th; music written by women composers will be featured at both the 8:30 and 11:00 services that morning.
- Our Bach Music Meditation Lenten Series returns on Wednesdays beginning
 March 12th from 12:00 noon until
 12:30 pm in the Nave. Listen to the

 for the six Wednesdays of Lent (March
 12 April 16), including Holy Week.
- Music at Passiontide will take place on Good Friday, April 18th at 7:00 pm. This year, a setting of the Passion story will be performed in the Nave with choir and strings. The music has been written and composed by your Music Director, dedicated to and for our Parish Choir.

AMERICAN EXPRESS FEES

We have been informed by Vanco, our credit card processor, that AmEx has increased their interchange and assessment rates for non-profit organizations. Starting February 10th, the Contemplative Prayer Group will be exploring the writings of Julian of Norwich. Julian was a mystic and prophet who lived from 1342 to 1416, during the time of the dreadful bubonic plaque. She "sheltered in place" as an anchoress at St. Julian's Church in Norwich, England. Spending much of her time in contemplative prayer and journaling, Julian wrote down several of her revelations. She is mostly known to us through her book, *The Revelations of Divine Love* which is widely acknowledged as one of the great classics of the spiritual life and was the first book in English by a woman.

Inspired by Julian's writings, Thomas Merton, a 20th century Trappist monk, called her a "true theologian" and "one of the most wonderful of all Christian voices." Merton was impressed by Julian's authenticity, originality, and faithful prayer life. In the midst of a world struggling with fear and uncertainty, Julian encourages us to never lose trust in our gracious God. This central message of trust is conveyed through her most famous quote, "All shall be well, and all manner of thing shall be well." Come and join the Contemplative Prayer Group. As we explore the unique insights and wisdom of Julian's prayer life, we will have an opportunity to grow and be blessed in our own prayer life.

Call for Eucharistic Visitors

The Pastoral Care Commission for Christ Church has trained parishioners who unselfishly take communion to their fellow parish members who are home bound or unable to attend church services. These Eucharistic Visitors bring the Eucharist to church members in the hospital, nursing homes, and individual homes.

You see them at the end of our Sunday services; parishioners come up to the altar and receive a box with the consecrated Eucharist. They take that Eucharist to fellow parishioners who cannot join us at church.

We are continually in need of additional volunteers to be trained as Eucharistic Visitors. We also need receivers, those who receive this Sacrament at home or elsewhere.
