# PRACTICING AND OBSERVING ADVENT

Advent is a time of reflection and preparation. We aren't just thinking about the first time Jesus entered the world, but remembering that his eventual return is part of our faith and belief, too. Advent can be a time of taking on an extra intention or devotion like one might do in Lent. It could be that you commit to praying for a specific person or purpose, giving of your time or money to a cause that helps share the love of God with people, or taking a few minutes to read (or read more) scripture.

Between the 8:30 and 11:00 services Sunday/today, Suzanne and I will have a time in the Chapel where we talk about the meaning of Advent and what you can do to hold it as a sacred time, even while the world around us feels like it is spinning faster and faster. We will also have all the things for you to make an Advent wreath at home.

During Advent, you'll notice some additional encouragement to be more intentional in our worship.

Before the Service, speak to the Lord. During the Service, let the Lord speak to you. After the Service, speak to one another.

During the season of Advent, we encourage you to enter worship in silence and to remain quiet until the service begins. Silence allows us to center ourselves and prepare to meet with God. Silence calls us out of the noise of the world and acts as a threshold into the holy space of worship. Silence molds us into an attitude of humility before our Creator—being slow to speak and quick to listen.

May he whose second Coming in power and great glory we await, make you steadfast in faith, joyful in hope, and constant in love.

## November 20 Vestry Recap

- Vestry discussed adding a Replacement Fund to the budget. This would be used to replace or repair items around the church.
- Revenue from the rental of the spaces in the parking lot will be used to replace signs and stripe the lot.
- The Director of Christian Formation position remains open, and vestry is hopeful for the position to be filled in early 2024.
- Staff will have modified December hours based on staff and volunteer schedules.
- Discussion around Annual Meeting on December 10th. In addition to providing the Treasurer's Report, we will bring a question to the congregation for discussion. We will have a discussion on how we could change bylaws to change how new vestry members are nominated.
- There was continued discussion around the sound system. Speakers will be replaced. The system itself needs adjustment, and the church is looking into adding the ability for those with hearing aids to be able to connect to the system.
- The AED's are here and will soon be installed. We have also added Narcan to all the first aid kits at church.
- Vestry approved changes to the commissions structure.

#### MINISTRY COMMISSION REPORTS

**Stewardship** - The campaign is going well, and pledges have been coming in strong. **Building & Grounds** - Pumpkin Patch had a record year. Committee is preparing to "Green" the church yard and grounds in December

Outreach - Over 100 backpacks were prepared and donated.

**Parish Life** - Volunteers are always needed. Recent meeting was well-attended, with positive good energy.

**Pastoral Care** - We continue to look for Lay Eucharistic Visitors and anyone who may like to have communion brought to them. If interest is shown, there will be training session for Stephen Ministers beginning in January.


# The Longest Night: A Worship Service for the Weary

### **Vestry-Appointed Committees**

Each year, the Vestry is responsible for appointing new members to various committees in the Church. For 2024, the open positions are:

- -- Endowment Board (one four-year term; meets quarterly to review the current assets in the Endowment and to review how those funds are allocated; a background in investing is very helpful)
- -- Finance Committee (Two positions, three-year term; meets monthly to review the parish's financial position; serves an advisory role to the Vestry)
- -- Note: Previous Finance Committee members must have been off the FC for two years before being re-appointed.
- -- Diocesan Convention Delegate (Diocesan Convention is in Greenville, February 9-10, 2024)
- -- Two positions for a three-year term (Must have been off for two years before re-appointment)
  - -- Two alternates for a one-year term
- -- Personnel Committee (Two three-year terms, one one-year term; meets periodically to review policy and procedure and job descriptions)

# 2023 Angel Tree Project

Angel Tree is a Christian prison ministry in which Christ Church has participated since 1984. We serve approximately 55 children who reside in Craven and Pamlico counties and have at least one parent who is currently incarcerated. The prisoners sign up for this program through the chaplain at their prison.

Since COVID, we now send gift cards to the custodial parents for him/her to purchase presents. We have received very positive feedback from the families, and they are overwhelmed by the generosity of Christ Church.

We are hoping to raise at least \$5,000 this year. If we receive extra funds, we will also be able to send grocery gift cards and provide gift cards to our GIG children.
