
on assistance with getting started with Realm, uploading your photo, and learning parish committee basics.

#### Mystical Hope: Trusting in the Mercy of God

When we encounter struggles and challenges in our daily life, we yearn for the good news of hope to pull us through our difficulties. As we journey through the wellsprings of hope, we're invited to grow in our understanding of how we perceive this gift in our lives. Do we see hope through the lens of desired results, or do we see it through the lens of trust? Author Cynthia Bourgeault says, "In our usual way of looking at things, hope is tied to outcome: 'I hope I get this job' or 'I hope my mother gets well.' The Bible introduces us to a different kind of hope that has its source not in events but in the mercy of God, a lifeblood of compassion connecting our heart to God's heart and the heart of all creation." You are invited to come and participate in the weekly Contemplative Prayer group, which will explore and study the book, *Mystical Hope: Trusting in the Mercy of God*. During each session, we will support one another in our pilgrimage of prayer and our search for a deeper understanding of God's gift of hope. Let us trust that in the search itself, as we open ourselves to God's transforming love.

#### **ECW Geranium Sale**

#### **VESTRY MEETING RECAP**

The vestry of Christ Church met on March 18, 2024, in the Parish House.

- Phyllis Fox opened the meeting by reading two spirit-filled prayers.
- The Vestry reviewed and approved the February Vestry Meeting Minutes.
- John Haroldson reported on Finance. The Balance Sheet was unchanged; it is stable. The January Budget was strengthened by big, pre-paid pledges. February's Budget is expected to be on target with pledges. Currently, the Church has strong revenues and is below budget estimates because some salary expenses are not present. The 2024 Budget was approved without discussion. "People are giving."
- Randy Bogle and Rebecca Leahy shared a review of Chapter 3, entitled, "Building Strong Leadership Teams" from the Episcopal Church Foundation's Vestry Resource Guide.
- The Parochial Report was reviewed by Paul and received by the Vestry. More details to come later.
- The Rector's Report noted from the Episcopal Parish Network Conference, "We're not alone in our struggles and our joys. Paul led discussion about Communion, cups, and intinction; it was agreed, by the end of May some changes will take place preceded by several weeks of education to instruct parishioners and ease a gradual transition.
