Music Notes

We have a wonderful musical season ahead of us with our new Opus 85 Taylor & Boody organ! Our Dedication Events are scheduled for September 19th and 20th, with a Dedicatory Eucharist service on Thursday the 19th at 7pm, and the Dedication Concert with concert organist Nathaniel Gumbs on Friday the 20th at 7pm. I highly recommend showing up early to both events in order to secure a seat!

Following the Dedication Events, which will kick-off our music season, there will be plenty of other opportunities to experience listening to the new instrument outside of Sunday morning worship. For the October Artwalk, I am scheduling a live-improvised Silent Movie Night with the organ and the German Expressionist film, The Cabinet of Dr. Caligari (one of my favorite spookie silent movies!). Last year, I gave a performance on a Skinner organ in Connecticut with this film, and the audience just loved it! I'm sure the community of New Bern would also enjoy this experience and hearing the new organ, so stay tuned for more info!

In November, we'll again feature the new organ for Artwalk -- this time inviting people to sign up to get a chance to play and try out the instrument (with my supervision, of course). Kids are welcome to sign up! Then, in December, we'll hold our annual Christmas Carol Sing-along event for Artwalk, but of course this time featuring Opus 85.

There are many more musical events coming up, including an All Saints Requiem Concert on Friday, November 1st, Lessons & Carols on Wednesday, December 18th, and a Spring Organ Concert Series. Look out for details in The Crown, Messenger, and Social Media, and please share with your friends! 
Hand Bell Position Open

Godly Play (children ages 3-4)

Godly Play is a class centered around storytelling and work time, which includes crafts and play. We will focus on teaching basic stories and what it's like to spend time in a Sunday School class. This class will meet in the Godly Play room, next to the nursery.

Whirl (K-2nd grades)

This class is using the Whirl curriculum -- the same curriculum as the older Whirl class. Students will watch videos and follow up what they have learned with worksheets. The best part of Whirl will be the craft each week! This class will meet in the room next to the vesting room.

Whirl (3rd-5th grades)

This class uses the Whirl curriculum -- the same curriculum as the younger Whirl class. The discussions will be different because of the age difference, but these students will see similar videos and work on slightly different worksheets. The best part of this class will be what the students will learn about the Bible and the church. We will meet in the Purple Pineapples room.

Pathways of Discipleship (POD)

POD meets at 4 pm, the first Sunday of the month to play games and share our faith. This group is for children in grades 3 -- 5. We will meet in the Purple Pineapples room.

Study Book: Praying with Meister Eckbart: Companions for the Journey by Wayne Simsic

This fall, the Contemplative Prayer group will be exploring the writings of Meister Eckhart, one of the greatest Dominican spiritual masters of the fourteenth century. Ekhart was a mystic, medieval professor, and popular preacher. Thomas Merton, a twentieth century monk, was inspired by Ekhart's preaching and said, "I like his brevity of sermons, his way of piercing straight to the heart of the inner life, the awakened, the creative and redeeming Word, God born in us." God born in us -- Eckhart calls this the "spark of the soul" in which "the core of the soul and the core of God are one." In one of his most famous quotes, Eckhart says, "God expects but one thing of you, and that is that you should come out of yourself in so far as you are a created being made, and let God be God in you."

During each week, there will be time for prayer, contemplation, and discussion. As we reflect upon the spirituality of Meister Eckhart, we will search for different ways to "let God be God" within each one of us. Let us trust that in the search itself, we open ourselves to God's transforming love

"School bells are ringing loud and clear; vacation's over, school is here." – Winifred C. Marshal



Our program is successful due to our amazing volunteers that come to offer their support and love as mentors to our children. The mentors work one-on-one with our children for about 45 to 50 minutes on homework, school work review or completion, study for tests and most importantly to offer the children a new friend in their life that cares about their success in school and in life.

We are always looking for new volunteers to join us. All volunteers must have a background check through the Episcopal church and complete an online program on safeguarding God's children.
