Adult Formation is served by additionally by the Contemplative Prayer group, the Women's Book Study, the Rector's Bible Study, and Sacred Sound.

Vacation Bible School is a vibrant program for children in pre-school through grade 5 that meets for a week in the summer. There is always an engaging theme explored through Scripture, movement, art, and science.
