

Camp Hope Sunday

Today is Camp Hope Sunday. Terry Brubaker, our longtime Camp Hope coordinator, and Hannah Hutchens, formerly Camp Trinity's assistant director and now Christ Church's Director of Christian Formation, are joining us today to speak about Camp Hope. Please join us during coffee hour to learn more about Camp Hope.

This is Camp Hope and Christ Church's 19th year of helping kids attend summer camp. While there have been changes over the years, Camp Hope remains a ministry that allows children with an incarcerated parent or step-parent to attend overnight summer camp free of charge. Children in the foster care system are also eligible to participate. And beginning last year, we invited our GIG children to join our program. We had 26 Camp Hope campers attend Camp Trinity last summer. Angel Tree Camping paid the tuition for seven of those campers to attend Camp Trinity, and your donations funded the rest. We are excited to report that 31 campers are registered to attend Camp Trinity this summer.

Our campers enjoyed Camp Trinity's religious programming, water activities, the dance, canteen time, and one camper mentioned that he liked sleeping in his own bed since, at home, he has to share with his brother. Attending Camp Trinity gives our campers a chance to just be kids – to escape the worries of their daily lives and to build a deeper relationship with God. We recently had three teen campers attend Camp Trinity's Winter Retreat. Because of your past generosity, we could cover their retreat registration fees.

How can you help?

Pray for our campers and their families, Camp Trinity, and our Camp Hope ministry.

Volunteer: Christ Church volunteers drove twenty Camp Hope campers to Camp Trinity last year. We will need help with transportation this year. We host reunions and pre-camp meetings for our families and need volunteers to help us with these events. **Ingathering**: If you missed Camp Hope's February ingathering and would like to participate, please contact a Camp Hope leadership team member. Our campers might have last-minute camp needs that you can help us with. Last summer, we also brought snacks to the Camp Trinity staff. Please let us know if you would like to help provide the camp staff with care packages.

Financial Support: Your financial support is vital for continuing this ministry. Your donations not only cover registration fees and tuition but also help us purchase camp supplies and care packages. This year, Camp Trinity's tuition is \$665.00.

Thank you to the congregation for writing over 100 letters so that our 2024 campers received mail during rest period. This year, our parish card party will be between the services on Sunday, May 4th. Our pre-camp meeting will be that evening. We will be sharing exciting news about that evening soon. Thank you to the ECW for sending our campers birthday and Christmas cards.

Thank you to all of our Camp Hope volunteers. Whether you prayed for us, donated to us, helped at our reunion or pre-camp meeting, or took campers to camp, you are an essential part of this ministry. Racial Reconciliation Meetings

Begun in 2020 (during Covid) with interviews and discussions, the goal of "Racial Reconciliation" is to "partner traditionally white churches with traditionally black churches to bring them together as a community." For several months, a team from Christ Church has worked with other church teams and representatives from Faith Connection* to bring this program to faith communities in New Bern. This year, Word of God Worship Center, First Presbyterian, and United Worship Center will host these conversations.

On March 2, Christ Church members are invited to join with parishioners from two churches in our community, Word of God Worship Center and Clinton Chapel, to share fellowship and conversation concerning racial reconciliation. The mission of this and subsequent conversations is to "Build bridges between races, classes, and religions."

We will gather as a large community at the Word of God Worship Center (3650 Neuse Blvd) from 4 - 5:30 pm. An overview of the program will be shared by the chair, Mike Williams. For 40 days we stop pretending that things will suddenly get better and face the truth: life is fragile, and so are we. We will explore being human, the complexity that life is both terrible and beautiful, how to lament, the gift that imagination can be in the face of all of this, and the wisdom and love we can gain from it. Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper



The season of Lent is fast approaching, beginning with Ash Wednesday on March 5th. Before we enter into this holy season of penitence, we pause to prepare ourselves. Traditionally, the period of Shrovetide was observed before Lent often with indulgence in food items that many would abstain from during Lent and by going to a priest for confession. The English word shrive, means to give absolution for someone's sins, thus Shrove Tuesday was named after the custom of Christians to be "shriven" before the start of Lent. The Tuesday before Ash Wednesday is the last opportunity for this to happen.

Today we tend to celebrate Shrove Tuesday by eating pancakes. Join us for a pancake supper on Tuesday, March 4th from 5:00 - 6:30 pm in the Harrison Center. We will have pancakes, syrup, sausage, and bacon. Tables will be set up for dining.

Adult plates are \$6, children's plates are \$4 for ages 3-10. Children under the age of 3 are free. There is a \$20 maximum per household.
