Behind the Scenes but at the Heart of Worship: Be Part of the Altar Guild


Did you know that every beautiful worship service at our church is made possible not just by clergy and music, but also by a dedicated group working quietly behind the scenes? We're talking about the Altar Guild, and we'd love for you to be part of it!

The Altar Guild is a special ministry of women and men who lovingly prepare the sanctuary for worship. From polishing silver and brass, to arranging linens, to making sure everything is in place for Holy Communion, baptisms, weddings, and more - this team works with quiet care and joyful hearts.

And here's the best part: you don't have to be retired or have loads of free time to join. Many of our members have full-time jobs, families, and busy schedules. This is a flexible, team-based ministry. Most volunteers serve just a few hours every couple of months.

Altar Guild member Suzy Jordan shares, "My favorite responsibility is assisting in preparing the Altar for the Tuesday morning Eucharist. I love the intimacy of the Chapel and the service."

For others, like Nell Hudson, one of the most meaningful aspects of the ministry is the fellowship. Working



together as a team, supporting one another, and sharing a sense of purpose and joy in their service.


Vestry Meeting Recap -June 2025

UTO Thank Offering

Every year Christ Episcopal Church practices gratitude through participation in the United Thank Offering. The money we raised during the month of April was combined with monies collected by many Episcopal Churches around the country and then awarded as United Thank Offering grants to support 27 innovative mission and ministry projects focused on water-related issues around the world. More than \$1 million was given to help to support projects ranging from a reverse osmosis filtration system to combat lead-contaminated drinking water in Western Louisiana, to indoor plumbing at a South Dakota congregation, to water-saving agricultural projects in Tanzania and California's Central Valley. Our engagement in saying thank you to God for all we have been blessed with has helped people around the world have a better day today because they have clean water.

During the month of July, Christ Church Outreach is collecting items to support MERCI Clinic. 

Women's Book Study

On Tuesday, August 5th, the Women's Book Study will begin reading *Acedia & Me* by Kathleen Norris. Copies of the book are available for purchase at the reception desk (\$10.00).

Norris is a poet and essayist whose work focuses on the intersection of religious practices and the spiritual journey. In *Acedia & Me*, Norris explores all aspects of acedia, with the particular purpose of drawing a distinction between it and



depression. Acedia, coined the "noonday demon" by the early monastics, is a type of spiritual apathy, and is often described as a weariness of soul. Though it is not readily a part of the modern scientific lexicon, acedia, in today's culture, is generally lumped in with depression and the sin of sloth, one of the supposed seven deadly sins. We treat it with medication, just like everything else. But, as Norris continually illuminates, acedia possesses spiritual roots, and, thus, can ultimately only be treated with spiritual attention and resolve.

Join us Tuesdays from 10:00-11:00 in the 2nd Floor Living Room. Women of all ages are invited to attend. We open our time together with prayer, followed by reading the book aloud, and discussing. No preparation is necessary. You can join the group at any time.

Music This Sunday

In honor of July 4th Independence Day, this Sunday features music written by American composers and with patriotic themes. The prelude is "Toccato" by Florence Price, a native of Arkansas and the first African American woman to have a symphony performed by a major orchestra. The postlude is Charles Ives' famous Variations on "America." Ives was from Connecticut and one of the most well-known American composers in classical music.
