


Blessing of the Animals

Fall Food Drive for RCS

This fall Christ Church is partnering with **Religious Com**munity Services to collect specific food items. These particular items are what would be most helpful at this point. RCS has asked us to purchase canned meat, canned beans, canned soup, mac & cheese, pasta sauce and meal helpers (Rice-E-Roni, Hamburger Helper, etc.). Please do not buy anything in glass containers as this requires



additional wrapping and packaging. Also, please purchase 16 oz or 20 oz sizes rather than larger sizes (even if the price is right). These smaller sizes are what RCS has asked for.
