

The music is a response to and reflection of those readings, expressed via choral anthems and congregational hymns. We invite you to come experience this beautiful tradition with us tonight.



The Longest Night: A Worship Service for the Weary

Grief, loneliness, and longing are emotions many of us experience daily, sometimes for years, sometimes for a season. We carry these burdens, often quietly, without really talking about them. At



this time of year, it can seem as though we are the only ones without an easy smile and endless good cheer. Holidays alone, or without those we've lost, make us want to retreat from community. Christ teaches us that together we are stronger.

Join us on Thursday, December 21st at 5:30 pm in the chapel for Eucharist and a worship service focused on The Longest Night. Although the season of Advent is joyful for so many, we also know that the holiday season can be drenched in fatigue, grief, and loneliness for many of us. Music featured in this service are selections from *The Book of Sounds*, written for piano by German minimalist composer, Hans Otte. The meditative nature of these pieces help bring an awareness to the relationship between sound and silence, and they allow space for the listener to find stillness and peace within.

Let us gather together as a community to draw near to God and to allow space for healing and prayer. We are stronger together.

From the Church Office...


- During the weeks before and the week after Christmas, the church's office hours will be 9 am 3 pm, Monday Thursday and 9 am 12 noon on Friday. *Please note that the office is closed December 25 and 26.*
- During the week between Christmas and New Years, most classes and gatherings, including Tuesday morning Eucharist, are canceled.
- The deadline to submit cash or check payments to the Financial Office is 12 pm, December 28.
- Online payments must be set up with start and/or end dates of **December 27** on your account. These can take several dates to transmit, so confirm that your payment date shows no later than **December 29**.



Woman's Book Study

On the second Tuesday in January, the Women's Book Study will begin reading *Everything Happens for a Reason: And Other Lies I've Loved* by Kate Bowler. Copies of the book are available for purchase at the reception desk (\$15.00).

Bowler is an Associate Professor of American Religious History at Duke Divinity School. This memoir details the emotional, spiritual, and physical journeys she took after being diagnosed



with stage IV colon cancer at age thirty-five. Kate was stripped of certainty only to discover that without it, life is hard but beautiful in a way it never had been before.

Join us on Tuesdays from 10:00-11:00 am in the 2nd Floor Living Room, as we explore uncertainty in our own lives and the gifts God has for us in the midst of it. Women of all ages are invited to attend. We open our time together with prayer, followed by reading the book aloud, and discussing. No preparation is necessary. You can join the group at any time.

- Interfaith Refugee Ministry is so grateful for the continuing support of Christ Church for over 30 years. We are happy to report that we are back to receiving more refugees than we have received the past few years. Our number of individuals since October totals 43, with 19 more expected by the end of the year. Although we have been able to stockpile many items, we are in need of the basics to furnish a home. This includes gently used bed sheets and blankets (twin, full and queen sized), gently used pots and pans, and new personal hygiene items. These items can be dropped of to 1913 Trent Blvd., New Bern, NC 28560, or purchased online and shipped to our office We can also use gift cards in any amount. Thank you for helping us welcome the stranger.

The children we serve live in Craven and Pamlico Counties and have at least one parent who is currently incarcerated. The prisoners sign up for this program through the chaplain at their prison. With the funds that are raised, we send gift cards to the parents for him/her to purchase presents. We have received very positive feedback from the families, and they are overwhelmed by the generosity of Christ Church. We are hoping to raise at least \$5,000.
