# **MUSIC AT CHRIST CHURCH** A LOOK AT THE ORGAN CONSTRUCTION PROCESS

One of the themes most often associated with Advent is that of anticipation. Waiting, expecting, and keeping watch. Now that Advent is behind us, and I know the people of Christ Church have been waiting a long time for the new organ, we are certainly ready for our instrument's arrival!

Building an organ is no small feat. Builders actually completely construct the instrument first in their shop (to make sure it works!), then they take it apart, transport it to the location (a project in itself), and then rebuild it in the church. And at that point the organ is still not ready. How can this be, you might ask? After the instrument is constructed in the location, and everything is working properly, a specialist from the team comes in to "voice" the organ. Essentially, this person is responsible for crafting the tone quality of every single pipe, of which there are many! They carefully work through each pipe of a stop (or sound) in order to blend everything perfectly together and create a seamless sound that is beautiful and full of color and character. And then they work on the next stop. This process takes weeks, but is arguably one of the more important aspects of organ building in terms of quality and beauty of the sound of the instrument.

The amazing team at Taylor & Boody is working very hard to bring our new instrument to life and have recently sent us a few more pictures from their shop, shared here.

There are two important days in the welcoming of an organ to its new home: 1. The arrival day. Once we have this date, we'll need a party of people from Christ Church here to welcome the builders!; 2. The dedication concert. This second part will take lots of planning, however builders always advise not to plan this part until the organ is fully complete. So we will hold off on that for just a little longer.

A group of people from Christ Church are hoping to visit the Taylor & Boody shop sometime in late January or early February. Bowler is an Associate Professor of American Religious History at Duke Divinity School. This memoir details the emotional, spiritual, and physical journeys she took after being diagnosed with stage IV colon cancer at age 35. Kate

was stripped of certainty only to discover that without it, life is hard but beautiful in a way it never had been before.

Study Book: *Praying with Hildegard of Bingen: Companions for the Journey* by Gloria Durka (Used paperbacks can be ordered online through Amazon.)

You are invited to meet Hildegard of Bingen, a 12th century contemplative, who made a major impact on the spiritual lives of many people. In her day, Hildegard served in a variety of ministries – as an abbess, a counselor to popes and emperors, a homeopathic healer, a composer, a renowned preacher, the author of nine major books, and the founder of an abbey at Bingen, Germany. This 12th century holy woman has recently emerged as a spiritual mentor for our times. "What is so attractive about Hildegard's spirituality for today?" asks Gloria Durka, author of Praying with Hildegard of Bingen: Companions for the Journey. Durka tells us that Hildegard's spirituality, "seems to fill a vacuum in the heart and mind of people who are journeying toward the center of life." Today, in the 21st century, we are journeying toward the same spiritual center as Hildegard. This January, come and participate in the weekly Contemplative Prayer Group with Hildegard of Bingen as our spiritual guide. During each session, we will support one another in our pilgrimage of prayer and our search for spiritual growth. Let us trust that in the search itself, we open ourselves to God's transforming love.

#### Godly Play (children ages 3-4)

Godly Play is a class centered around storytelling and work time, which includes crafts and play. We focus on teaching basic stories and what it's like to spend time in a Sunday School Class. This class meets in the Godly Play Room, next to the Nursery.

#### Whirl (K-2nd grade)

This class is using the Whirl curriculum — the same curriculum as the older Whirl class. Students watch videos and follow up what they've learned with worksheets. The best part of this Whirl class each week is the craft! This class meets in the room next to the Vesting Room.

#### Whirl (3rd-5th grade)

This class uses the Whirl curriculum — the same curriculum as the younger Whirl class. The discussions are different because of the age difference, but these students see similar videos and work on slightly different worksheets. The best part of this Whirl class is what the students learn about the Bible and church. We meet in the the Purple Pineapples Room.

#### Youth (6th-12th grade)

Our youth will continue working through tough questions and also learn more about people in the Bible and watch videos. These students meet in the Youth Room upstairs (across from the Second Floor Living Room).
